TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

We are aware that the financial investment in a Catholic education can place severe financial burdens on many families who often make great sacrifice, under difficult circumstances, to provide quality education for their children.

To be eligible for tuition assistance for the BSS 2011 – 2012 school year, students and their families must demonstrate financial need as well as a desire for a Catholic education. To achieve and maintain eligibility for tuition assistance, the following guidelines must be met:

1. The student and family must be involved in the parish life as evidenced by attendance at Mass and regular parish giving.
2. The student's conduct, attitude and attendance must be in accordance with BSS standards.
3. The family must complete and submit the Student Aid Form and fee to FACTS by the established deadline of **May 31, 2011**.
4. New applications for tuition assistance must be completed each year; tuition assistance will not be automatically renewed.
5. Families who apply for assistance must still make payments, based on their balance, following one of the options offered to our parents.

Failure to meet any of the above guidelines may jeopardize the application for tuition assistance.

Those who feel they are unable to meet the financial commitment and who fulfill the obligations above should indicate on their registration form that they will need a paper application or will be applying online at www.factstuitionaid.com. Families who complete an application by the deadline should receive a letter by the end of July stating the required tuition due.

FACTS Grant & Aid Application

We use the FACTS program to assist us in developing and managing our tuition assistance program. FACTS provides an objective family financial analysis that determines in a fair, impartial, and consistent manner the ability of a family to pay for a Catholic education at BSS. Families interested in tuition assistance will complete an application called the "Student Aid Form" to provide information regarding their financial status. (Families who have completed an application at SHG do NOT need to complete another application.)

By applying a formula that has been especially designed for families with children attending private and independent elementary and secondary schools, FACTS will analyze:

- Marital status of the parents
- Size of the family and dependency status
- Number of children in tuition-charging schools
- Age of the parents
- Total taxable and non-taxable income for parents (including child support, Social Security, welfare, etc.)
- Social Security expenses
- Expense information
- Child care costs
- Current value of additional real estate and other major assets
- Value of any business and/or farm ownership

Through computer analysis of the above-mentioned elements, FACTS produces a uniformly calculated "ability to pay" figure for each family.

Blessed Sacrament School administration will use the prepared analysis from FACTS to determine a family's eligibility for tuition assistance. This review and analysis is objective, consistent and confidential.

Any tuition grant given to a family comes from the parish or from people or institutions who give money to Blessed Sacrament School or Parish. It does not come from the diocese or from FACTS.
